For those that are new to the Society, I'd like you to "make the acquaintance of" our first three presidents. I'd like to share a bit of Society History with you for a moment.

John Walton McDougall of Nashville, TN was our first President of the Society. He was born December 26th, 1900 in New York City. His paternal grandparents were born in Caverton, Roxboroughshire, Scotland. His maternal grandparents were born in Ayrshire. All emigrated to Ontario in the last half of the 1800s. John Armstrong, a great grandfather, was one of the founders of Toronto.

In 1967 then Chief Coline MacDougall of MacDougall placed Dunollie and some 162 acres of ground around the castle under a protective covenant with the National Trust of Scotland. This step meant the preservation of the original seat of MacDougalls, Lords of Lorn, for generations to come. Here we are today in 2025 gathering with our MacDougall Chief and other clan MacDougall members in Oban at the original seat of the Lords of Lorn every 5 years.

In 1970 John W. McDougall was appointed "High Commissioner" by Coline MacDougall. As far as it was known then, this honor had never been given to another in Clan MacDougall. It was done with great consideration. There are so many points like these stored in our archives. Please Read the archives of the Tartan and the Raven to find the details of our first President and more.

In 1986, John A. McDougall became our 2nd President after serving 8 years as secretary for the Society. He served three years as President. It was during his presidency that we were given the status of a tax free charitable trust. This took much work and preparation for this to come to fruition. Today, we are still a 501(c)(3) Charitable Organization-a benefit we get to pass on to our United States contributors.

In 1986 through 1991, George E. McDougall took the term for our 3rd President. His term of three years saw a growth in members, requests for genealogy information, and the changing of the guard for our Clan Chief. Madame Coline MacDougall of MacDougall has many mentions in our Tartan issues from the first through the tributes given her in

1990 issues. The introduction of our Current Chief is also included in the archives.

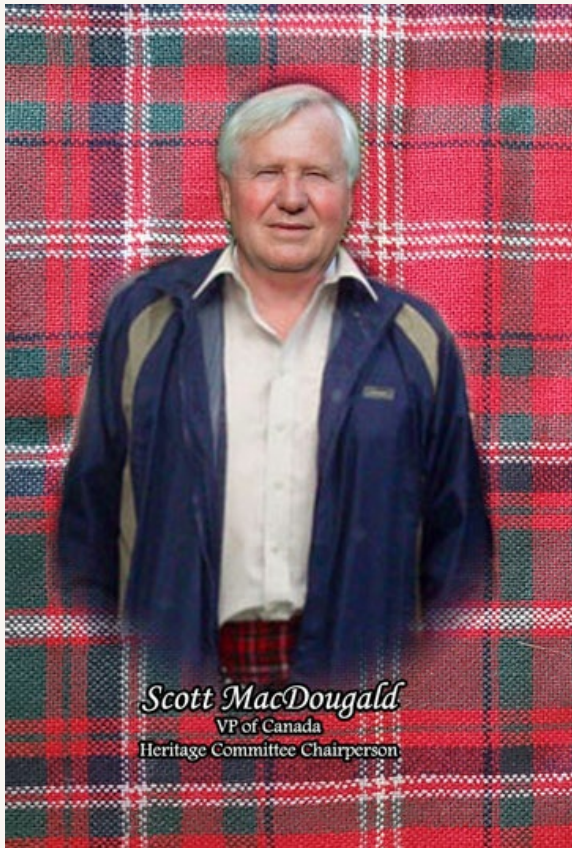

The Heritage Committee is always looking for writers and researchers who can write about MacDougalls, MacDougall history, Scotland, the MacDowalls, MacDowall history, Scottish history, and even members (past present and future) who are doing great things throughout our two countries, Canada and the United States.

FairHill Highland Games - Maryland, May 17th, 2025

So here I am standing in front of my MacDougall/MacDowell ClanTent at the Fair Hills Festival, Yes, I was flying solo this time and it shows. Fortunately I arrived at the Festival site during the mid- afternoon on Friday 05/16/25 just after the first round of inclement weather had blown through. This time the Festival organizers set up the Clan tents on the macadam track behind the grandstand as opposed to the previous site in the field opposite the horse showing circle which had the ground consistency of a peat bog.

After securing the rented tent, table, and chairs, I managed to get the tent up and staked at the rear to some solid ground at the back poles and used a rope to tie it to the boundary fence that wrapped around the horse circle behind it this was a very prudent step as later that evening the main torrent arrived with a spectacular lightning show that raced across the skies coupled with heavy rain and gusty

winds.

Early the next morning, I came back to the Festival site with some degree of apprehension but was elated to see that the Clan tent had survived the night intact and upright apart from a brief shower that occurred around 7 a.m. that morning. I was fortunate to have the Clan MacKay tent situated immediately to my right and was able to watch the orderly and practiced process as their Tent presentation took place in contrast to the way I proceeded. So I am now initiated into the ranks of a solitary Clan advocate. A rite of passage indeed! Deserving of a wee dram to toast the event and to soothe a bevy of sore muscles.

Now on to the Garrett County Celtic Festival in Firendsvill, MD. That takes place on June 7, 2025. After that I am headed to the Wet and Wild West Virginia Celtic Festival in Beverly, WV on June 21, 2025. Please come on by if you are so inclined!! It's great to visit with our guests!
